## 1940's Weekend in Pickering – Fell race organiser steals the show!

### Le'Visham Saltergate

North Yorkshire rolled back the years and the tanks rolled in, as Pickering had its now traditional Autumn 1940's World War Two makeover. Dave Parry was not quite sure what had happened as the Le'Visham Saltergate Fell Race coincided with the 18<sup>th</sup> Pickering 1940's weekend and LeVisham became LeVisham.

### Le'Visham became French pour le weekend

Saltergate became Saltergate+ and after its third makeover in as many years, the second Fell Race of the Winter Series has become **LeVisham Saltergate** (16/10/2011). Following the imposition of parking charges at its former start point and after our warm welcome at Lockton (LeVisham Limping), Dave decided to continue his tour of village hall committees at LeVisham Village Hall. We were warmly welcomed and the tea and cakes were terrific by all accounts.

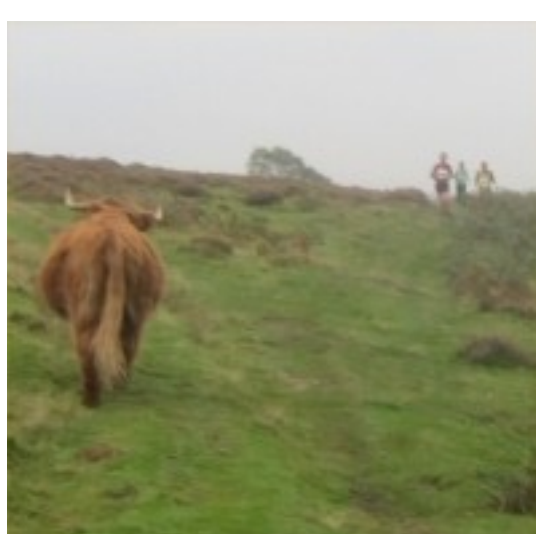
The many Ridings of Yorkshire were represented in an eclectic top-10, **Stuart Carmichael** of City Of Hull Harriers took the victory and new open race record in a cracking time of 76 minutes 3 seconds for the 11 mile race, just beating a resurgent Charlie Stead of Northumberland Fell Runners some 40 seconds back. North Riding honour was upheld by home club runner, **Cameron Taylor** of Esk Valley Fell Club who had a tremendous run in 4<sup>th</sup> place to establish an Esk Valley open and junior record. Andy Blackett of Durham Fell Runners came home 3<sup>rd</sup> and visitor Dale Foster of Otley AC made up the top-5.

In the team competition it was a double header win for **Esk Valley Fell Club** following up their victory in the Winter Series opener – Viking Chase 4 Peaks. Backing up Cameron in 9<sup>th</sup> place was Joe Johnson easing himself back to form, Dominic Barry in 16<sup>th</sup> (new M40 and M45, more competition!), and Stuart Backhouse in 19<sup>th</sup> and a return to form for an M50 record.

**Esk Valley Fell Club** continued its terrific presence in the local races with 12 runners completing the event and being the only team to finish a 'B' team. The 4<sup>th</sup> placed B's were, leading home Mick Quinn in 35<sup>th</sup>, Neil Byron 39<sup>th</sup>, Sam Williams 49<sup>th</sup> and David Gibson 50<sup>th</sup>.

In the ladies competition, Nicola Kent was first home in a brilliant 12<sup>th</sup> place for Loftus and Whitby (2<sup>nd</sup> home for L & W overall) and a time of 89 minutes 28 seconds for a new ladies open record, and leading the Loftus and Whitby ladies to ream victory.

Making up the 12 Eskers to finish were, John Hazell in 59<sup>th</sup>, Chris Jamieson (70+ races for the season so far!) in 60<sup>th</sup>, Joe Williams 64<sup>th</sup> and 72<sup>nd</sup> Ian Robinson. 82 competitors made it to the finish line, dodging the tanks, trains and Highland Cattle!

### Further afield

Two Eskers made the trip to the **Three Shires** (17/09/11) fell race in the Lake District, Thomas Hodgson came in 184<sup>th</sup> in a time of 3 hours 3 minutes and 12 seconds for the 13 miles race distance and 4000' of climb. Certainly not a race to be under-estimated as its round 5 of the Lakeland Classics Trophy, Thomas just pipped his Dad, Ian Hodgson (NYMAC), and second Esker home was Ian Harmer in 3 hours 46 minutes and 51 seconds from the 288 finishers. As no other Esk Valley competitors have completed the race, new records posted, good efforts all round.

On the same day Chris Jamieson continued his assault on the FRA calendar completing **Rombalds Romp fell versus trail race** based around Ilkley, competing in the fell race, Chris finished 86<sup>th</sup> in a time of 1 hour 16 minutes 27 seconds for the 7 ish mile route.

The 27<sup>th</sup> **Pathfinder challenge** was held on 8<sup>th</sup> October 2011, the LDWA event has two distances 15 and 25 miles taking in the moors around Kildale and Comondale. Warming up for the LeVisham Saltergate, Cameron Taylor finished the 15 mile route in 1 hour 49 minutes for a best time on the day for Esk Valley and claim a club best, 2<sup>nd</sup> place was claimed by Steve Murton for Esk Valley too, in 2 hours 16 minutes, which matched Mike McGough's previous club record. If there had been a team competition, Esk Valley would of done really well as Sheldon Cockburn came home in 2 hours 17 minutes and Andrew Bennett in 2 hours 24 minutes. In the 25 mile challenge, who else but Chris Jamieson came home in 6 hours 28 minutes.

Richard Clark rounded off his **Lakelands Classic Trophy** assault at **Langdale Horseshoe** (08/10/2011) with 129<sup>th</sup> from 343 finishers in a time of 3 hours 9 minutes 22 seconds for the 14 mile race, over some of the toughest terrain that the Lakes have to offer. The LCT consists of six races; Duddon Valley, Ennerdale, Wasdale, Borrowdale, Three Shires and Langdale, three must be completed to qualify for the final table. Richard completed all the Dale races and finished 40<sup>th</sup> overall from the 102 that qualified, a tremendous achievement, WELL DONE!

### Albert parkrun

In our only nod to the black stuff the Eskers have been making their presence felt at the 5km Albert parkrun recently. The event is held every Saturday morning, start time 9.00am, locally there is the Middlesbrough event, then Newcastle, Sunderland and recent addition Durham. 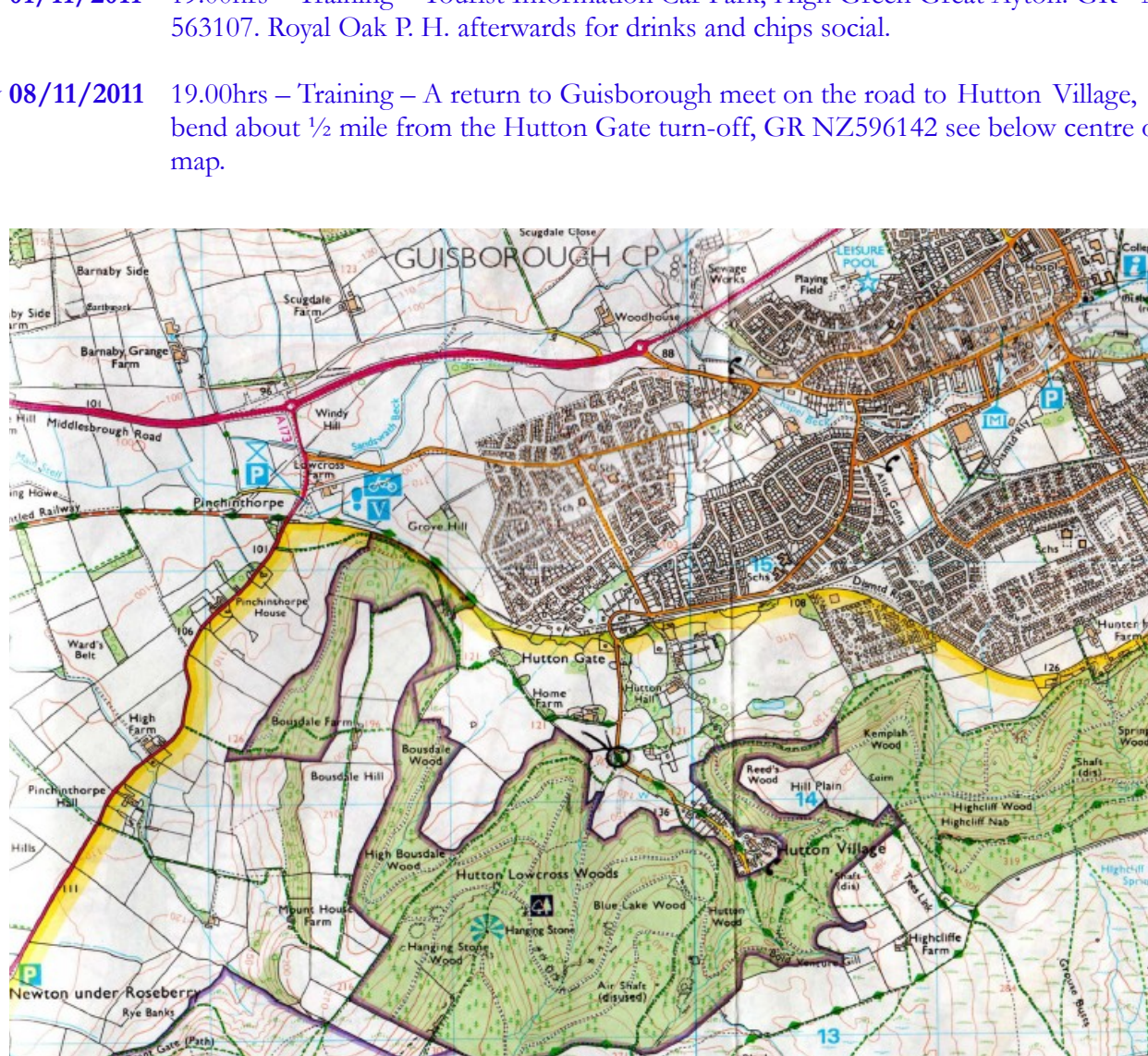

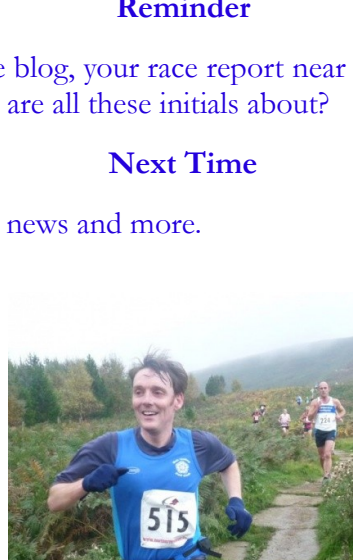
