Mickledon Straddle (06/02/2011) – Two Eskers made the trip to West Yorkshire for this 14 mile event, Kevin Holmes continuing his Three Peaks preparation, placed 80th in a time of 2hr 26m 55s and Chris Jamieson in another double header weekend placed 177th in 2hr 59m 58s.

Wadsworth Trog (12/02/2011) – Another weekend in West Yorkshire for Kevin Holmes this time for 20 miles and 4hr 7min 49s and 71st place from a field of 132 finishers.

Castleton Beacon (13/02/2011) – Another terrific Castleton based race, on classic moorland terrain, saw not quite a 100+ field due to the distraction of the blackstuff based Poultry Run make the start line. First counter in this year's club champs saw 13 Eskers cross the finish line. Lewis Banton of Clowne RR led home, Cameron Taylor continued his terrific form placing 5th overall within one minute of the winner in a new Esk Valley open record of 61 minutes 10 seconds. In a reverse of the Eureka positions, Dave Smith followed Cameron home in 6th position in an M40 record of 62m 22s, next up was convert from the road Joe Johnson in 19th and making up the 3rd placed 'A' team in 28th was Huw Liappiatt.

Shelli Gordon continued her sparkling form with victory in the female race, but with the other New Marske ladies at the Poultry Run, Scarborough AC took the team victory. Esk Valley B finished 6th, led home by Phil Conner (29th), Clive Thornton (40th), Mark Brown (43rd) and Barry O'Brien (55th), we also placed a third team in 8th, with Bob Lillie, Joe Williams, Jonathan Wallace and Ian Harmer, and Ian Robinson rounds off the Eskers to finish the race.

Poultry Run (13/02/2011) – Three Eskers that I could spot ran this mixed terrain event, postponed from its traditional pre-Christmas slot, but not quite the same for it, 250+ completed, Dean Stockwell was well placed in 27^{th} (53m 44s), Vince Stockwell – 93^{rd} (1h 22s) and Chris Jamieson added further to his list of events with 98^{th} in a time of 1hr 1min 22s.
